



Traidcraft Stall

What is the Traidcraft Stall?

The Traidcraft Stall operates after the 10am service in the Hall on the first and third Sundays during coffee. It sells a wide range of fairly-traded and responsibly-produced foods and other products, thereby helping farmers and producers who often live and work in disadvantaged countries. The quality of the food and other items for sale is usually very good. For a wider range of products a catalogue is available and orders can be placed. A team of helpers run the stall.

How much time is involved?

Each volunteer usually gets a slot on the rota once every two months to run the stall (n.b. there are always two people on the rota for each Traidcraft stall so you're not doing this by yourselves!) This involves setting up in the hall before the 10 o'clock service (all the products stored in the hall and are in easily accessible boxes with a trolley to move them if carrying is a problem), collecting the cash tin (usually from Norma Buck), running the stall during coffee after the service and then putting things away afterwards.

What is worthwhile or enjoyable about this activity?

All the lovely food and other things on sale (!), and the knowledge that one is supporting farmers and producers, particularly from poorer countries. It is also a very good way to meet and get to know people – both fellow volunteers, and customers.

Are there any particular skills or abilities that are helpful for volunteers to have?

None really, although a little basic arithmetic might not be a bad thing! Full training is offered.
